Course Objectives

Perinatal Potpourri: Reaching Out and Looking Forward

At the conclusion of this workshop the attendees should be able to:

- Identify modifiable prenatal risk factors for neonatal encephalopathy and review appropriate obstetric prevention strategies
- Weigh available evidence and recommendations for the management of intrahepatic cholestasis of pregnancy in 2016
- Distinguish between neonatal encephalopathy and hypoxic-ischemic encephalopathy and discuss risk factors and clinical management of both
- Discuss the use of therapeutic hypothermia including findings from clinical trials and long-term outcomes and the importance of brain monitoring
- Understand the importance of gestational age in the evaluation of risk factors for early-onset neonatal sepsis
- Describe alternative strategies for management of late preterm and term infants with perinatal risk factors associated with increased risk for early-onset neonatal sepsis
- Identify areas of neonatal care that are subjects of active investigations expected to change practice in the near future, as well as, implications for current practice of recently completed trials
- Delineate the special requirements of electronic medical records for neonatal/perinatal care and describe local approaches to addressing these challenges
- Review obstetrical management of abnormal fetal heart rate tracings and describe how they relate to neonatal outcomes
- Discuss issues surrounding medical-legal exposure on labor and delivery and identify strategies to reduce medical liability
- Explain the clinical pharmacology of marijuana and its active components
- Describe the potential therapeutic effects, adverse effects and various dosage forms of marijuana
- Explain the impact of marijuana on the fetus and newborn infant
- Discuss recommendations and guidelines regarding marijuana use in pregnancy and lactation
