Protocol Title: Implementation and Evaluation of a Video-based Prospective Feedback Intervention to Improve Antimicrobial Stewardship in Neonatal Intensive Care Units

DESCRIPTION: You are invited to participate in a research study using an AAP endorsed video-based platform to provide prospective feedback. The primary goal of the study is to improve antimicrobial stewardship in NICUs. Secondary goals are to evaluate patient outcomes, feasibility of video platform for NICUs, and cost. No patient data is being collected. Participation includes routine video-based learning sessions, phone interviews, and online surveys. Learning sessions will be video recorded and phone interviews will be audio recorded. Only a small number of researchers will have direct access to recordings. If this study is published or presented at scientific meetings, names and other information that might identify you will NOT be used. We will protect your privacy by storing the audio and video files and survey responses on password protected devices.

TIME INVOLVEMENT: Your participation will take approximately one hour.

PERMISSION: With your permission, the interview will be audio recorded. *If you do not wish to be audio recorded, please indicate this to the researcher.* With your permission, the learning session will be video recorded. *If you do not wish to be video recorded, please indicate this to the researcher.* With your permission, the recordings from this study will be used for training purposes by other local NICU prescribers. *If you do not agree with this, please indicate this to the researcher.*

RISKS AND BENEFITS: The risks associated with this study are minimal. The learning sessions are similar to other professional education and training classes. Being audio recorded or video recorded can make some people feel uncomfortable. You are free to ask to stop the recording at any time. All recordings will be confidential. We cannot and do not guarantee or promise that you will receive any benefits from this study.

PAYMENTS: You will not receive any payment for your participation.

PARTICIPANT'S RIGHTS: If you have read this form and have decided to participate in this project, please understand your participation is voluntary and you have the right to withdraw your consent or discontinue participation at any time without penalty or loss of benefits to which you are otherwise entitled. The alternative is not to participate. You have the right to refuse to answer particular questions. The results of this research study may be presented at scientific or professional meetings or published in scientific journals. Your individual privacy will be maintained in all published and written data resulting from the study. Your private information collected as part of the research, even if identifiers are removed, will not be used or distributed for future research studies.
