

SUBJECT: 2016 BIRTH DATA QUALITY WORKSHOPS

Birth Data Quality Workshops The California Department of Public Health (CDPH) Vital Records (VR) is pleased to announce eight Birth Data Quality Workshops scheduled for the period March 2, 2016, through October 27, 2016. These workshops are an excellent opportunity to provide assistance to birth clerks, nurse managers, and local registrars with birth registration issues and to offer a forum for sharing ideas and information.

The Regional Perinatal Program Coordinators, Paternity Opportunity Program, and CDPH-VR staff will present at this year's workshops. Specific items to be addressed include reference tools to aid hospitals and local registrars in birth registration, the new birth certificate effective January 1, 2016 (Assembly Bill 1951, Chapter 334, Statutes of 2014), timely registration, improving birth data quality, and the Paternity Opportunity Program. There will be an opportunity for an open mic discussion to address any questions or issues raised.

Local registrars are requested to forward this information to all hospital and birthing center staff in their registration districts that are responsible for registering births. This training is especially important for all staff involved in the birth certificate process, including birth clerks, nursing staff, and administration staff.
