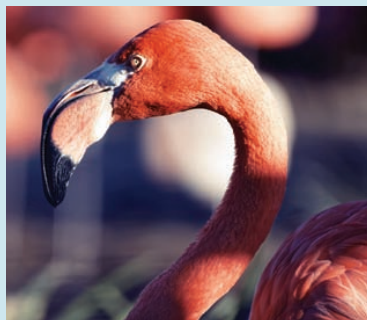
Coronado Island Marriott Resort
